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When to Report A WC Claim

Whenever a claim occurs, it is very important to notify us as quickly as possible. A claim should be reported whenever an employee suffers a work related injury and any one of the following circumstances results from this incident:

- The injured worker will need professional medical care (e.g. physician, hospital, etc.) as a result of a work-related accident.
- The injured worker will be losing time from work, regardless if medical treatment is rendered or not. ■ The facts of the accident are questionable (e.g. reported late, suspicious or might not be work related). ■ The employee requests a workers' compensation claim be submitted on their behalf.
- The employer receives an "Application for Adjustment of Claim" filed at the Workers' Compensation Commission alleging an employee suffered a work related injury and is claiming WC Benefits.

Even if a claim doesn't meet any of the above circumstances, it can be submitted anyway and we will record it as an "incident only."
